### **“THE ART OF BILL MORRISON” EXHIBIT** **through December 30th**

The museum's newest exhibit "**The Art of Bill Morrison**", which opened on October 15<sup>th</sup>, is a wide-ranging retrospective on the career of Lincoln Park native, **Bill Morrison**, an award-winning cartoonist and illustrator and the Creative Director for Bongo Comics. A few highlights among the nearly 200 pieces in the show are a drawing Bill made of his family at age 6; the Lincoln Park High School yearbook from 1977 for which Bill, a senior, designed the cover art work; limited edition prints created for Walt Disney Co. and *The Simpsons*; and Bill's most recent project, the publication this year of *Dead Vengeance* a graphic novel co-created by Bill and his wife Kayre.

Also included are a *Futurama* lunch box and a "The Birth of Marge" jigsaw puzzle (a take-off on Botticelli's "The Birth of Venus"); illustrations Bill created while a student at Detroit's College of Creative Studies; and three early drawings – James Taylor, David Bowie, and the New York Dolls' David Johansen – which Bill drew for the attending groomsmen in his wedding in 1982.

Bill and his wife Kayre were in town from their home in Simi Valley, California to attend the exhibit's opening reception. A special presentation of the "Key to the City" was made to Bill by Mayor Tom Karnes. During the evening, Bill signed copies of his exhibit poster and spoke about his career highlights accompanied by a slide-show presentation.

The special short-term exhibit is accompanied by a poster and T-shirt; both designed by Bill especially for the museum to help promote the exhibit with sales benefiting the Historical Society and Museum. These specialty items are beautiful and very colorful, and would make excellent gifts for the holiday season! [please see photos on back page]. We have men's and ladies' T-shirts at \$20 each. The posters signed by Bill are \$25; unsigned posters are \$20. In addition, Bill has donated signed prints of two of his pieces – "The Rocketeer" and "Roswell", both of which are available for purchase.

We are very grateful to Bill for his contributions and the temporary loan of his art work. Additional exhibit items are on loan from Sue Morrison Mann, Tom Karnes, Steve Colwell, Tony Resst, and River's Edge Gallery in Wyandotte.

The exhibit remains on display through the coming holiday period, closing on December 30<sup>th</sup>. Special holiday hours are Tuesday, December 27<sup>th</sup> through Friday, December 30<sup>th</sup>, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Admission is always free.

## Remember the “Rouge Legacy Project”!

AS mentioned in our August newsletter, the museum is planning a special exhibit next year to coincide with the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of production of the Ford ‘Model A’ which made its debut in December 1927, at a time when our city’s development was at fever pitch. Lincoln Park’s growth in the 1920s was due largely to the continuing expansion of the nearby Ford Rouge plant, which produced the Model A. We are looking for area families who lived here at the time and had parents, grandparents, great-grandparents who worked at the Rouge plant.

### HERITAGE PLAZA UPDATE


