WHEREAS, the City of Southgate has expended large sums to put in place and refine an information system which the Cities of Lincoln Park, Allen Park, Melvindale, Wyandotte, Romulus, Wayne County Sheriff's, Huron Township, and Sumpter Township find desirable; WHEREAS, the parties to this agreement find it to be in their mutual interests to share the technology and thereby average down the costs thereof and at the same time improve the quality of public safety protection which they can provide to the community; and

WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement concerning the details of sharing of costs and responsibilities in a way which is fair and equitable for all and believe that this agreement should be set out in writing, pursuant to the requirements of the Public Act 35 of 1951, the same being MCL 124.1 et seq
