

What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is improving three large bridges, 13 smaller bridges, and repairing the road surface along I-75.

Work includes:


- Replacing the Rouge River Bridge deck on I-75 (the largest bridge in Michigan) and the I-75 bridge over Fort Street.
- Removing the obsolete I-75 bridge over Goddard Street and constructing two smaller bridges.
- Repairing 13 bridges, with proposed work varying from patching to deck replacement and widening.
- Adding an intelligent transportation system (ITS).
- Repairing I-75 pavement from Goddard Road to the Rouge River.

When Will This Be Done?

This project will begin in early 2017 and is expected to be completed in 2018.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Southbound I-75 traffic will be detoured for two years (2017-2018). Northbound traffic will not be detoured.
